# Letter from Karen A. Yarbrough

Cook County Clerk



Dear Friends:

As we begin a new year, we officially close the chapter on the 2022 Gubernatorial General Election with the publication of our signature Post-Election Report, which provides a comprehensive tabulation of election data as well as an analysis of the voting trends that shaped this election.

Overall turnout was low compared to previous years at 45 percent, but the turnout percentage does not exclusively reflect a lack of voter participation as there were more registered voters in suburban Cook County than ever before for this election. In fact, the 743,892 ballots cast was the second-highest number of votes recorded in more than 30 years.

Pre-Election Day voting in all its forms continues to trend upward with an increasing number of voters choosing to vote early or by mail. Pre-Election voting set a record in this Gubernatorial Election, at 46.8 percent of all ballots cast. Vote by Mail also increased by 29 percent from the 2018 Gubernatorial Election.

With more than 240 candidates running in a total of 137 individual races, the administration of the Gubernatorial Election is an extremely complex process that could not happen without the help of our talented Election Judges, Polling Place Technicians, and Election Staff.

In the months leading up to the November 8 Election, the Clerk's Office was facing a shortage of election workers and we put out a call to military veterans and Cook County residents asking them to consider serving as a judge. We were thrilled and extremely thankful for the enthusiastic response, which helped to ensure that all our precincts were adequately staffed. Thanks to those who stepped up to serve, we delivered a successful, safe, and fair election in suburban Cook County.

This 2022 Gubernatorial Post-Election Report has been assembled to provide a comprehensive look at voting totals, trends, and statistics throughout suburban Cook County. 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# Gubernatorial Election Turnout

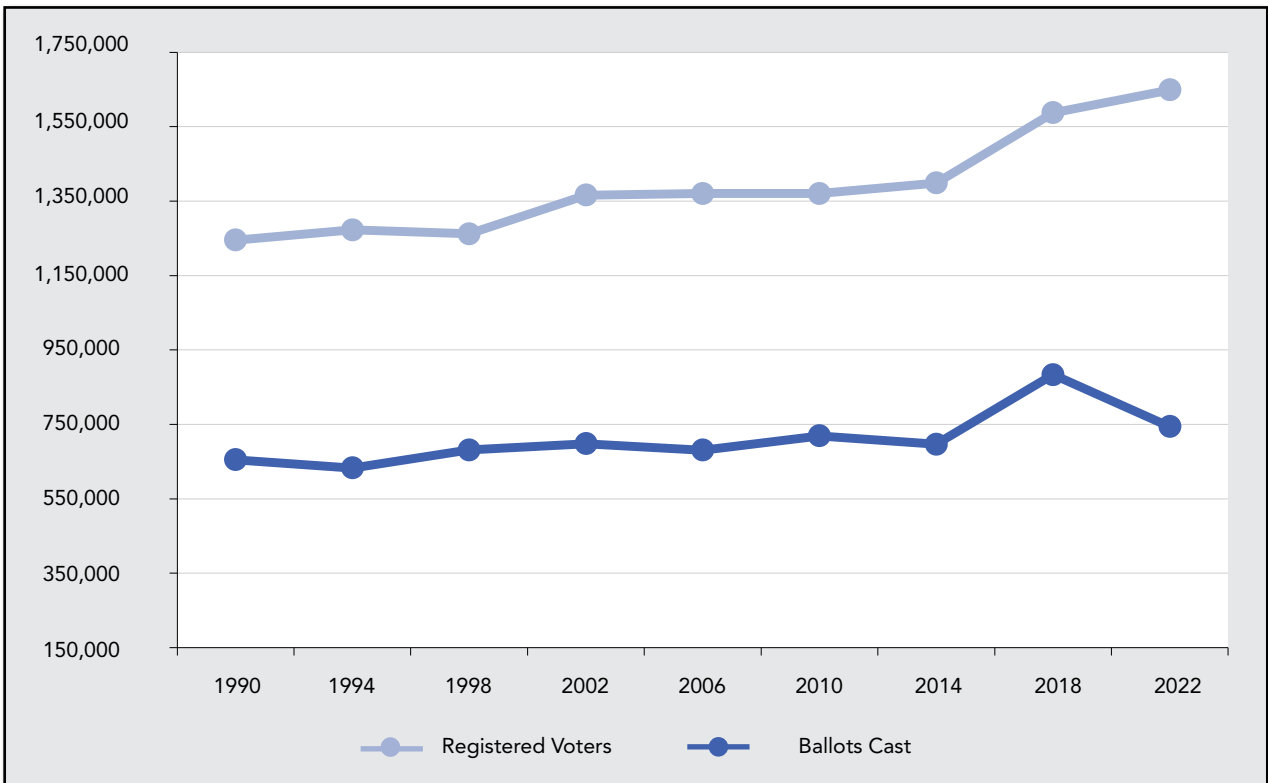
With 45 percent, the November 8 Election had the lowest voter turnout for a Gubernatorial Election since at least 1990 – making this year’s contest the lowest turnout for a Gubernatorial Election in more than 30 years. However, the 743,892 ballots cast were the second-highest number of votes in the same timeframe.

The turnout percentage does not exclusively reflect a lack of voter participation, as there were more registered voters in suburban Cook County than ever for the November Election. Additionally, voters chose to participate prior to Election Day with Pre-Election Day Voting accounting for 47 percent of ballots cast.

# Record Number of Registered Voters in Suburban Cook County

The November 2022 Gubernatorial Election saw a record number of suburban Cook County registered voters in a gubernatorial contest. The 1,648,706 voters are over 60,000 more than the previous gubernatorial record of 1,587,447 set in 2018 and 250,000 more than the Gubernatorial Election in 2014.

# Gubernatorial Pre-Election Day Voting Accounts for 47 Percent of Ballots while Mail Ballots see a 29 Percent Increase

Pre-Election Day voting in all its forms accounted for 46.8 percent of all ballots cast – a new Gubernatorial Election record. The 348,164 ballots cast before Election Day – less than 25,000 shy of the 2018 record of 373,962 – was an increase of over 87 percent from the 2014 Election.

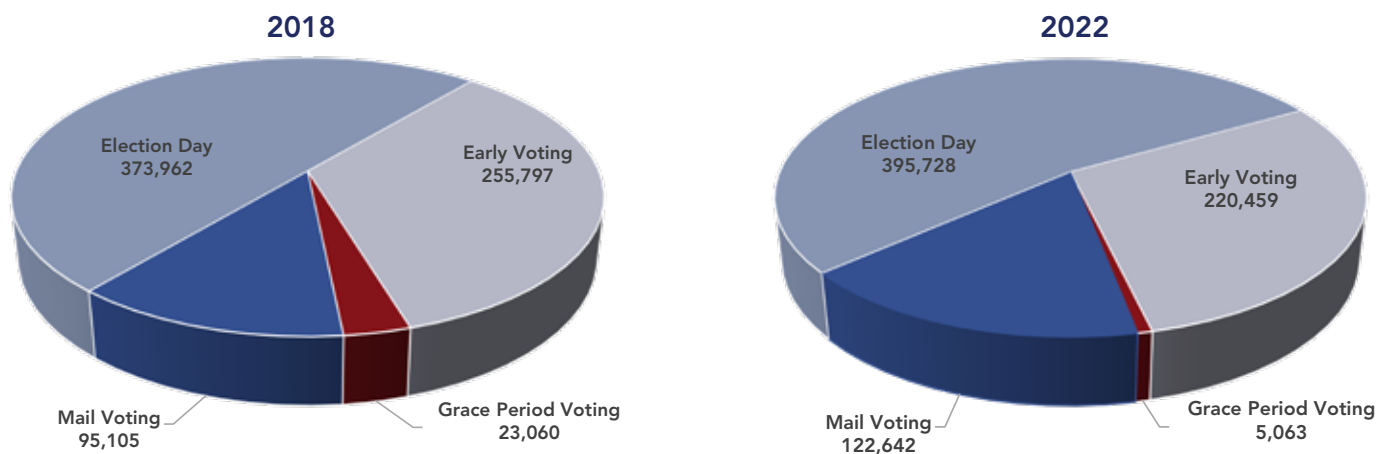
With 122,642 Mail Ballots returned, Mail Voting saw a 29 percent increase from the 95,105 ballots mailed in 2018. With the increase in popularity of Mail Voting and a record number of registered voters this election, we saw Grace Period voting drop by 78 percent to 5,063 from the 2018 total of 23,060. Early Voting also saw a drop in participation by 13.8 percent compared to the 2018 Primary Election.

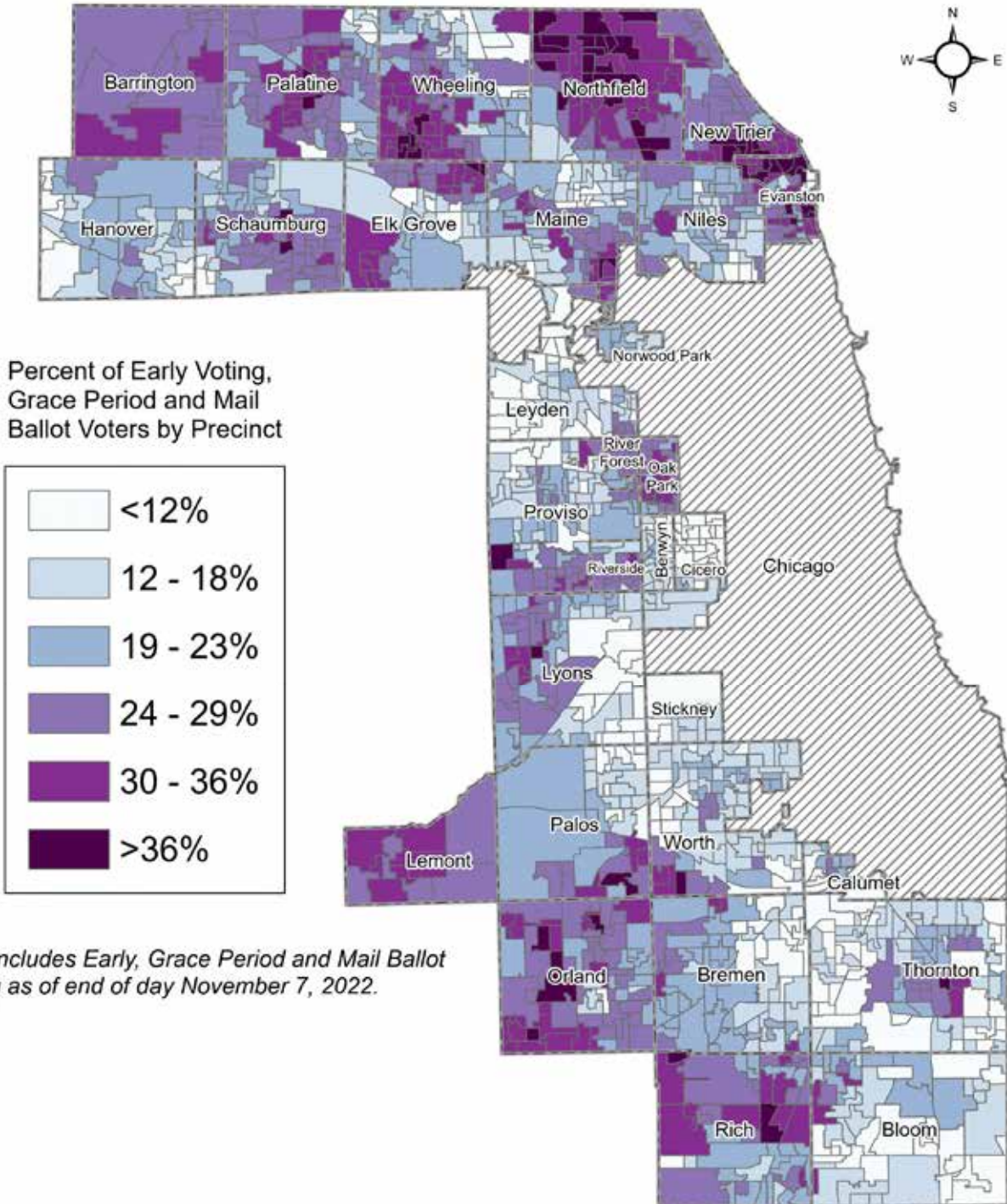

## Voting By Type: 2018 Gubernatorial vs 2022 Gubernatorial



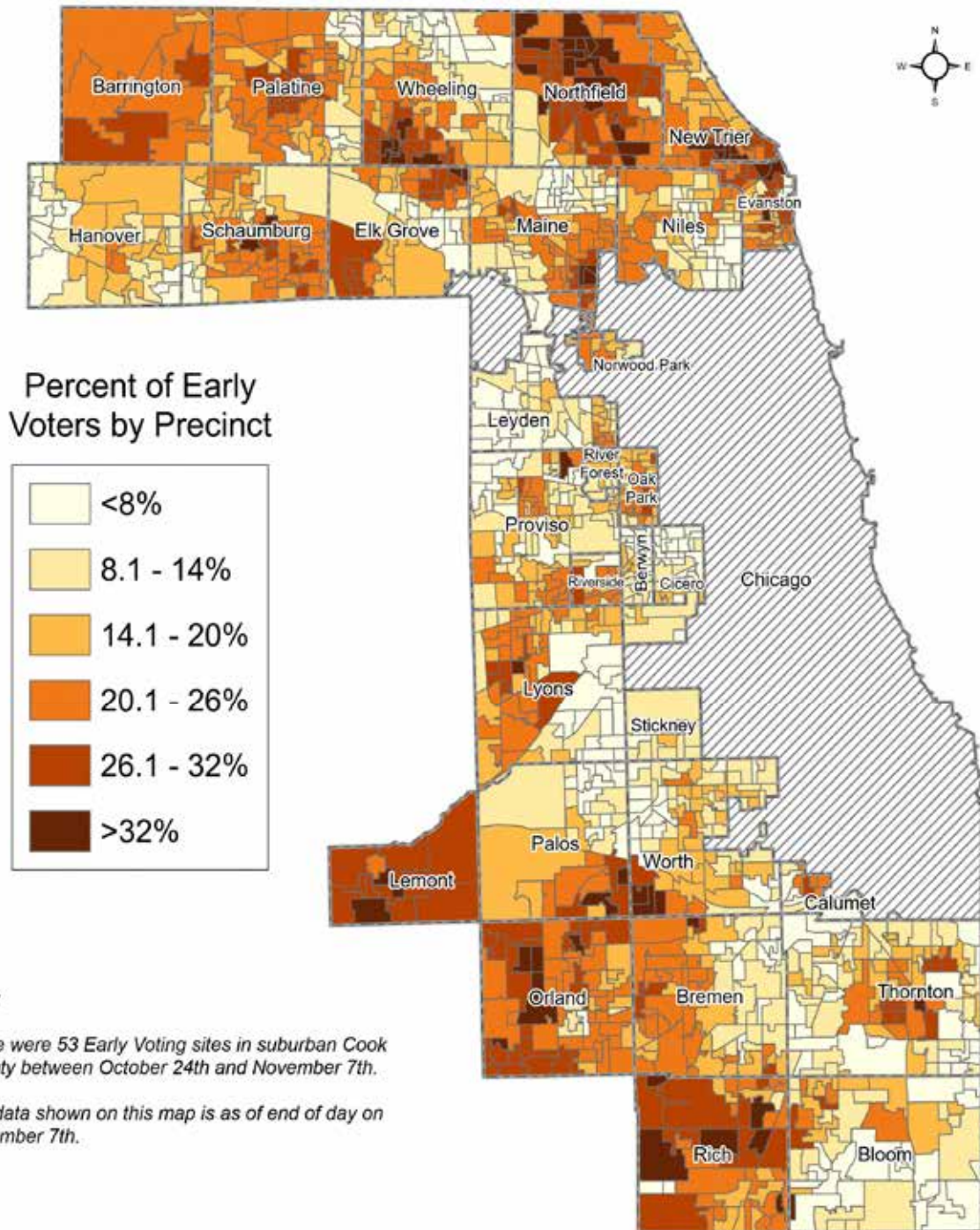

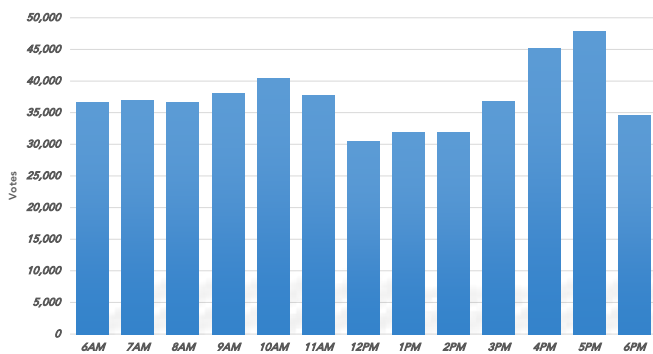

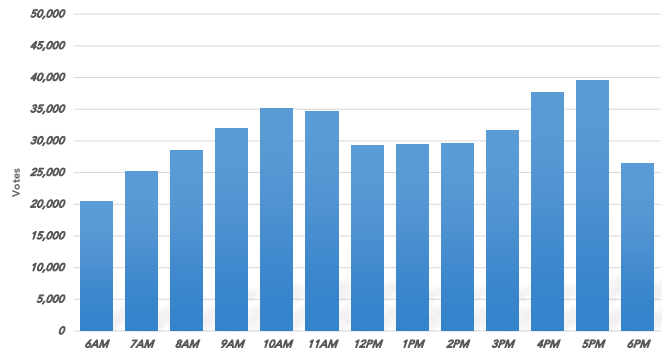
## Election Day Voter Turnout by Hour

An analysis of the time of the day that voters went to the polls on Election Day shows that turnout started slowly but built throughout the morning before leveling off in the early afternoon. The pace picked up mid-afternoon, leading to the busiest two hours of the day, between 4 – 6 p.m. The busiest one-hour block on Election Day was between 5 – 6 p.m., when nearly 40,000 voters cast their ballots at the polls. In comparison to the November 6, 2018, Gubernatorial Primary Election, the voting trends are consistent – albeit at a lower volume: voters tend to head to the polls later in the evening with the busiest hour being from 5 – 6 p.m.

Gubernatorial Election**



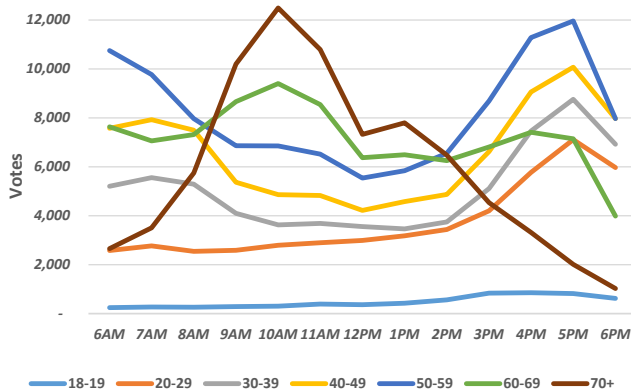

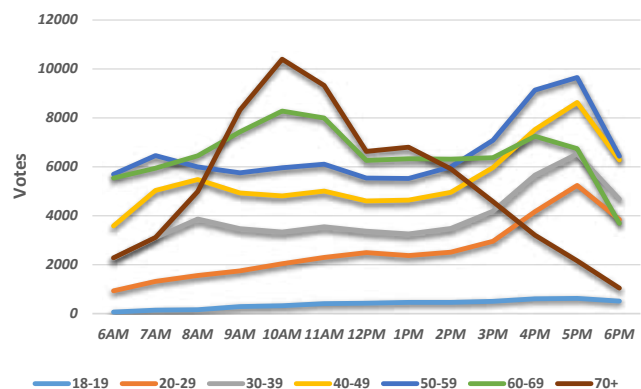
## Election Day Hourly Voter Turnout by Age

Data from voter check-ins at the polling place shows that generally, older voters tend to vote earlier in the day, whereas the greatest number of young voters casting ballots peaked near the end of Election Day. Voters ages 60 and older saw their biggest spike between 9-11 a.m. The three most popular hours to vote for those younger than 60 years old were all in the last three hours, whereas the three least popular hours to vote for all groups were between 6 – 8 a.m. By comparison to the November 6, 2018, Gubernatorial Election, the voting trends by age group have remained relatively consistent with voters in all categories showing up in similar time periods as they did in 2018.

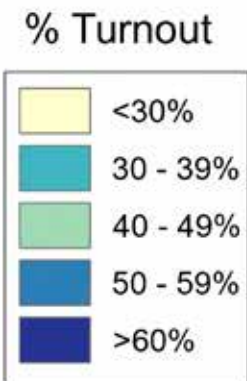
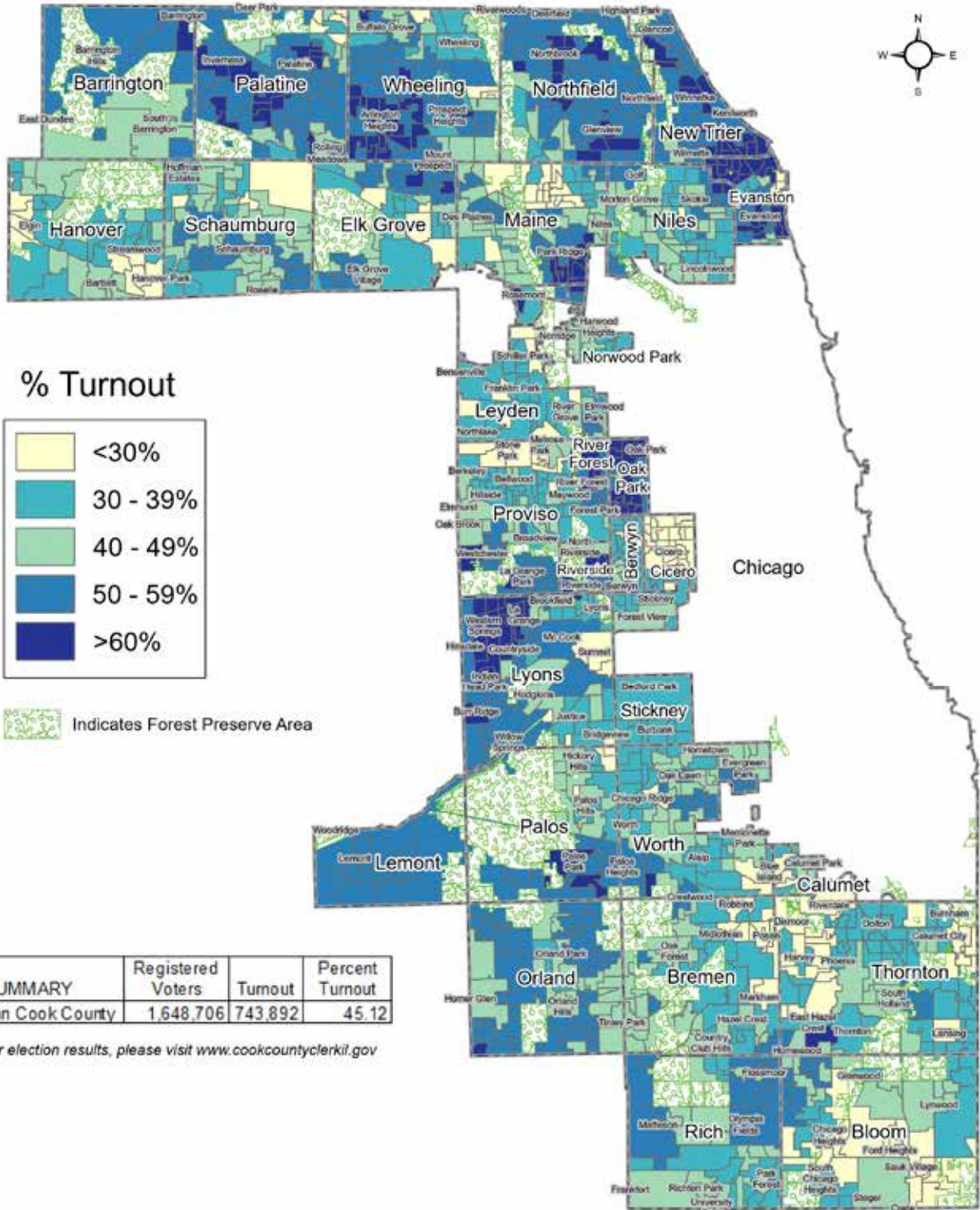

# Turnout Down in All 30 Townships

All 30 suburban Cook County townships saw a decrease in turnout percentage – compared to the 2018 Gubernatorial Election when voter turnout rose across each of the 30 suburban townships. A total of 24 out of 30 townships (80 percent) had their lowest Gubernatorial Election turnout in the last 20 years.

River Forest had the highest turnout (59.8 percent), overtaking the highest turnout township from past elections, New Trier. Along with the previously mentioned locations, nine additional townships also topped a 50 percent turnout threshold this election. For the fifth consecutive Gubernatorial Election, Cicero was again the lowest in township voter turnout.

Thornton Township had five precincts in the bottom 10 for turnout. Elk Grove, precinct 36 had the lowest voter turnout with 8.1 percent.

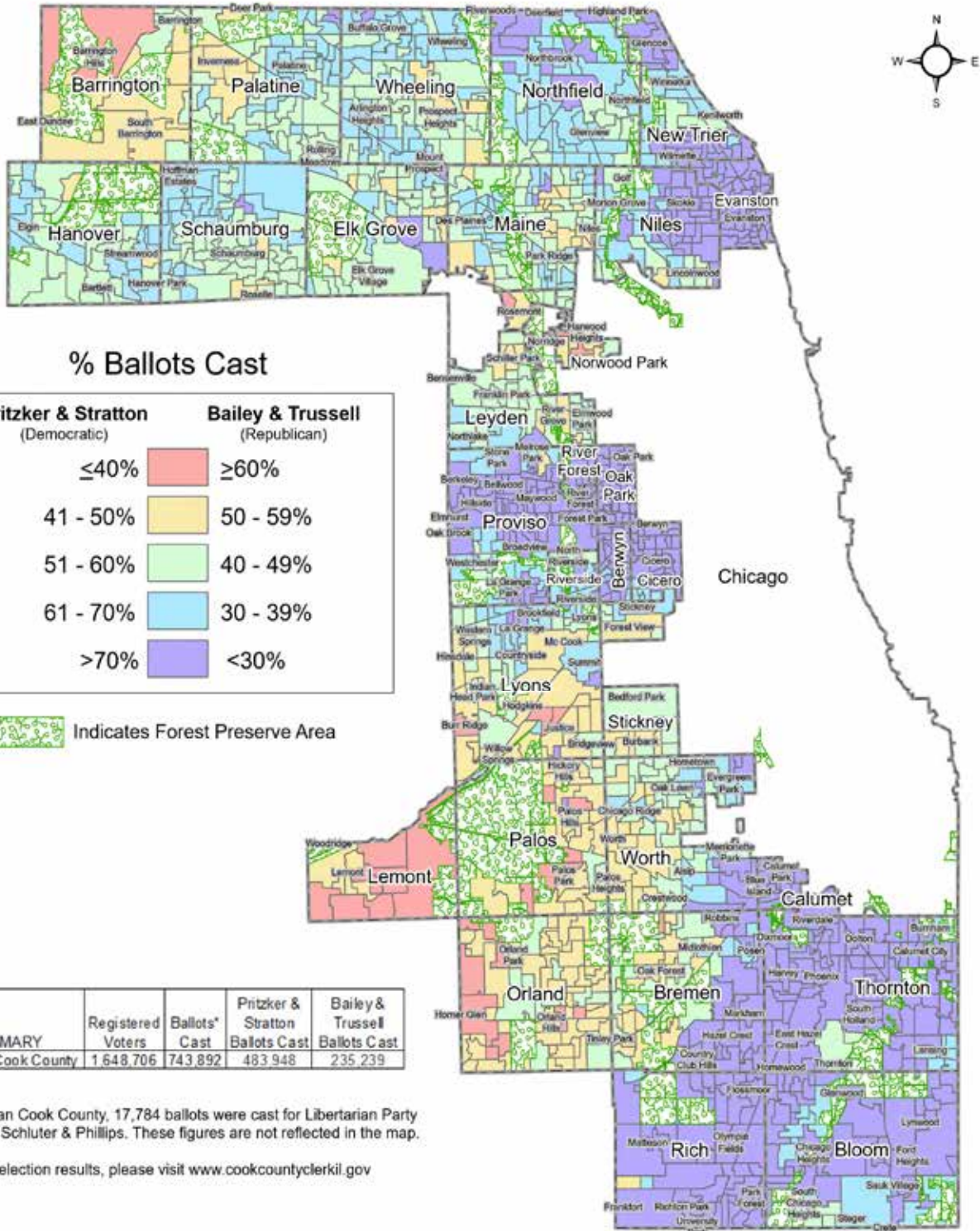

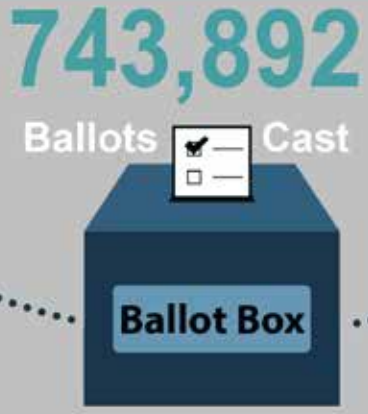
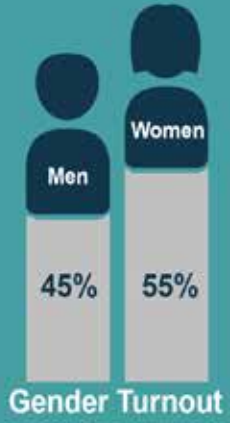

# Cook County's Oldest Voter Honored by Clerk Yarbrough

Clerk Karen A. Yarbrough made a special presentation of Valentine's Day treats to Ms. Susie Lewis – who at 111 years old – is Cook County's oldest voter.

Clerk Yarbrough visited Ms. Lewis' home on Valentine's Day to award her with a bouquet of flowers, a box of chocolates, balloons, and a card to commemorate her decades' love of democracy.

The Maywood centenarian was born in 1911 – nearly a decade before women's right to vote was ratified by the 19th Amendment in 1920 – and has been an eligible voter for over 93 years.

When asked why voting and turning out for your community is important, Ms. Lewis had this to say, "If you're able to vote – then you vote. You do the right thing because it does bring change."

It's people like Ms. Susie Lewis who help to keep our democracy alive and well. The Clerk's Office is so grateful for her commitment to the electoral process and her community.



# Languages in the 2022 Gubernatorial Election

Cook County has continued to expand ballot access and again offered suburban residents the opportunity to cast their ballot in one of 12 languages. Every precinct in suburban Cook offers touchscreen voting in any language -- while precincts in areas that meet eligibility requirements based on US Census data offer paper language ballots as well.

While many precincts offered more than one language in the voting process, several precincts had ballots cast in more than five languages (Table 1) and there were over 13,000 language ballots printed for the November 8 Election. In addition to Election Day ballots, voters requested nearly 600 language ballots via the Clerk's Vote By Mail program (Table 3).

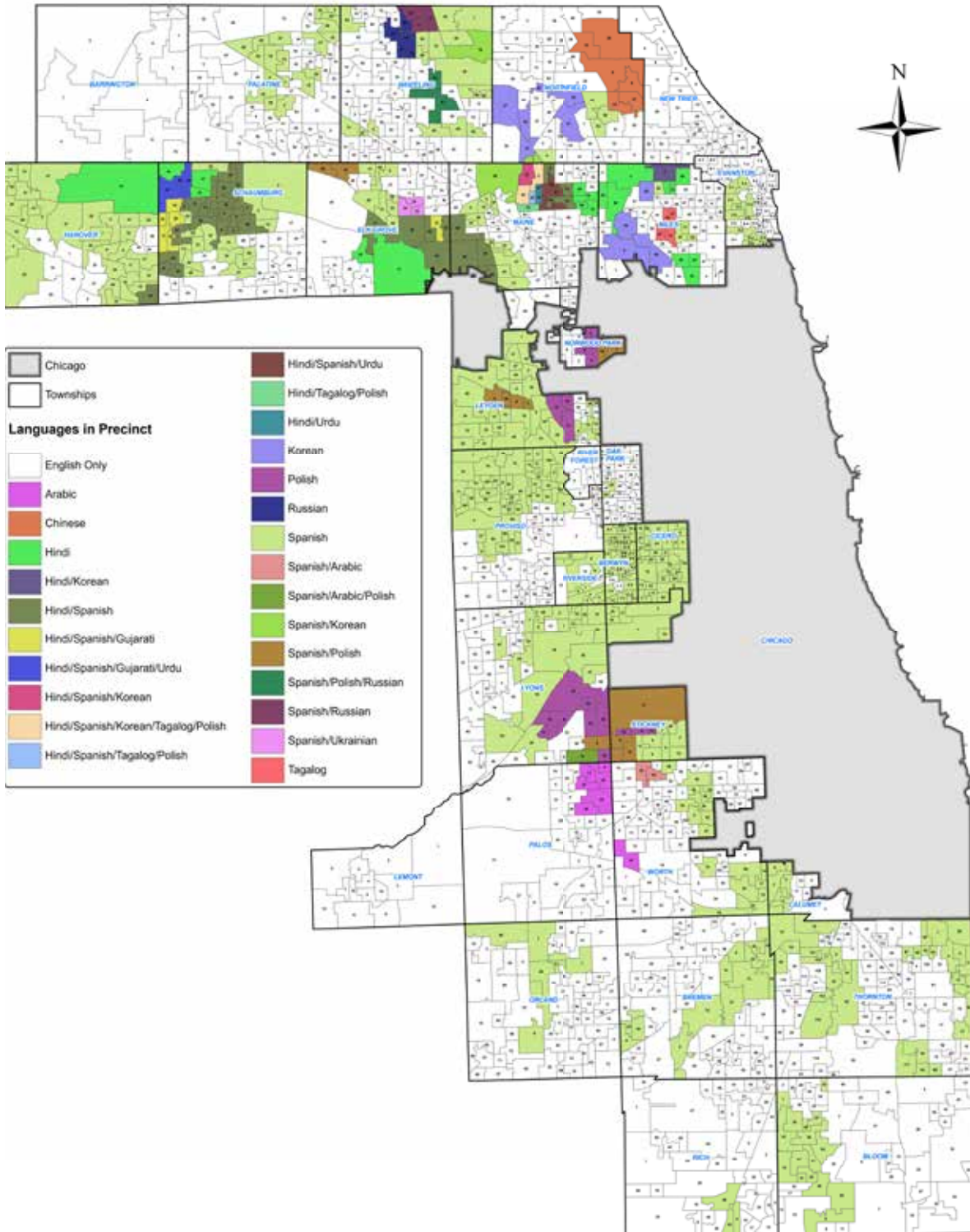

The Cook County Clerk's Office is committed to removing barriers to accessibility at all polling places in Suburban Cook County – making it easier for the elderly, disabled, and any voter who may need assistance to cast their ballot privately and independently.



It takes a dedicated team of Election Judges to make sure our 800 polling places run smoothly on Election Day. About 5,700 Election Judges, many of them veterans of multiple elections, worked the polls this Election Day.



Voters were allowed to choose from 12 ballot languages to cast their vote in the November 8 Election. Additionally, through community and media outreach, over 600 Election Judges who speak additional languages including, Hindi, Chinese, Korean, Ukrainian, and seven more languages were hired to work the polls for the Gubernatorial Election.



# An Online Presence in the Gubernatorial Election

For the third time in a Gubernatorial Election, voters were able to register to vote and apply for a Mail Ballot online. The implementation of these initiatives resulted in record-breaking numbers in almost every category.

Aside from a surge in numbers, the Clerk's online presence also helped Election Day run more efficiently. Online registration, Mail Ballot applications, and the Clerk's Voter Information Tool increased voter registration and turnout while decreasing lines by allowing eligible residents to register to vote and find their polling place from the comfort of their own homes.

## Election Day Online Usage

### Online Voter Registration

- Over 56,000 suburban Cook County residents registered to vote online leading up to the Gubernatorial Primary Election. An additional 89,400 voters updated their voter registration online from the comfort of their own homes.

### Online Mail Ballots

- 47 percent of the 146,097 Mail Ballot applications were requested online.

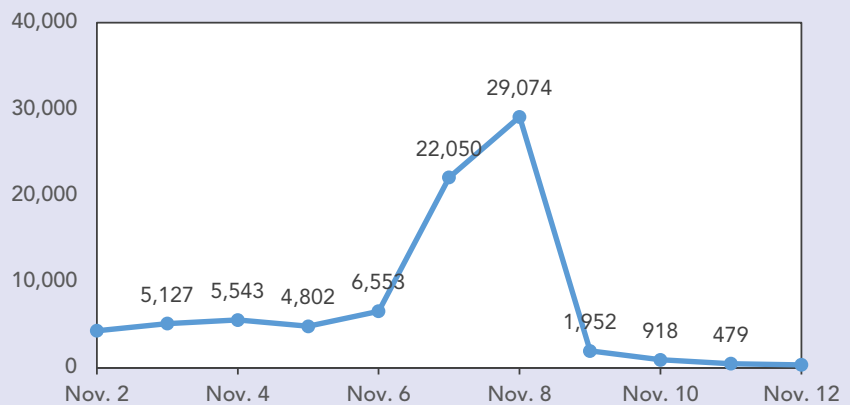
### Election Day Social Media vs. Average Social Media
